# Montana VFW members travel to Tarawa to bring back a fallen brother from the Battle of Tarawa November 20-23,1943.

he journey started in early 2019 when there was a meeting with the Defense Department of Accounting and the National VFW Leadership. When the Montana VFW talked to the History Flight, the organization that has their mission to recover the remains The Montana VFW asked if possibility Montana VFW members could go and help recover remains of marines from the battle of Tarawa. The answer was YES! The trip would be sponsored by donations and out of pockets by those would go.

Then the dreaded COVID hit shutting the entire world down causing

a nearly two and a half-year delay as well Government delays with Visa's and work permits, causing even further delays. Finally, fights were booked and lodging reservation were made then on October 9, 2023 one of the members, National Junior Vice C-I-C Select Tim Peters, suffered a near fatal heart attack that renderd him unable to go. On November 18, 2023 Fred Hamilton, Mike Pryor and Tim Sowa left on their journey of a lifetime to bring back a fallen brother. The dates the group would be there would fall on the 80th Anniversary of the Battle of Tarawa.






